1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During the reporting year, Sanrakshan Trust implemented a wide range of community-based interventions aimed at improving access to essential services and rights for marginalized communities, particularly waste picker families living in New Seemapuri, North East Delhi.

Key initiatives focused on strengthening access to legal documents, education, documentation, impairment support, Mental & Physical healthcare, legal awareness and ration support to extreme needy families. Notable achievements included the organization of large-scale eye health camps in collaboration with Shroff Eye Charitable Hospital, extensive documentation drives to facilitate identity and welfare entitlements, and sustained educational support through remedial classes and exam preparation.

The Trust also conducted legal awareness camps addressing critical social issues, while successfully renewing its 12A and 80G registrations, enhancing institutional credibility. Additionally, mass digitization of birth certificates and facilitation of documentation supported children's school admissions for the 2026–27 academic session.

These efforts reflect Sanrakshan Trust's continued commitment to promoting inclusion, dignity, and access to rights for underserved communities.

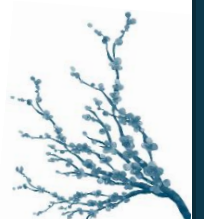

2. INTRODUCTION

Sanrakshan Trust initiated its field operations in May 2025 in New Seemapuri with support from the VedSan Foundation. Over the year, the organization expanded significantly, including a key partnership with the Azim Premji Foundation (November 2025), which strengthened team capacity and program outreach.

The Trust works with marginalized communities—particularly waste picker families—focusing on **strengthening access to documentation,**



education, healthcare, disability inclusion, legal awareness, and social welfare entitlements.



Sanrakshan Trust began its operations on 1st May 2025 in partnership with VedSan Foundation

3. ORGANISATIONAL GROWTH

- Initial Team: 3 staff members
- Expanded Team: 8 members (including Project Manager, Education Facilitator, Field Coordinators)
- Strengthened systems:
 - Case tracking and documentation
 - Daily help desk services
 - Community-based outreach model

4. COMMUNITY OUTREACH & SURVEY

5. DOCUMENTATION & ENTITLEMENT SUPPORT

A major focus area was enabling access to identity documents and government schemes.

A **daily documentation help desk** ensured continuous support.

6. EDUCATION PROGRAM – LITTLE STAR HOME



A flagship initiative providing a safe learning space for children from waste picker families. Currently, Sanrakshan Trust operates two learning centers.

Little Stars Home and Stars Home - Education & Child Development Initiatives are as follows:

- **Academic Support & Remedial Classes:**

Regular academic support and remedial sessions were conducted to bridge learning gaps among children, especially first-generation learners.

- **School Enrolment Support:**

Continuous efforts were made to ensure school enrolment for all children, including those without formal documents. Regular follow-ups and meetings with the Directorate of Education were undertaken to facilitate admissions. Sanrakshan Trust not only enrolling children from its working area, helping other organisations as well across Delhi.



- **Level-Based Learning Approach:**

A structured level-based teaching methodology was implemented to address diverse learning needs and improve foundational skills.

- **Creative & Co-curricular Activities:**

Activities such as drawing, music, and other creative engagements were organized to enhance children's imagination, confidence, and overall development.

- **Drawing Competitions:**

Periodic competitions were held to encourage creativity and provide children with a platform to showcase their talents.

- **Recognition & Motivation:**

Children demonstrating good performance and progress were recognized and rewarded, fostering motivation and encouraging peer learning.

- **Nutrition Support:**

Nutritional support was provided through the distribution of eggs, raw ration support to the extreme needy families, and khichdi packets



to ensure better health and well-being of children and their families.

- **Parental Engagement:**

Monthly parent meetings were conducted to review children's progress, address concerns, and strengthen community involvement in education. Parents were also guided on building healthy, supportive, and friendly relationships with their children to foster a positive home environment.



- **Health & Medical Support:**

Regular medical support was facilitated in collaboration with Primary Health Centre, GTB Hospital, IHBAS, and VedSan Foundation. This included access to medicines, essential medical equipment, and diagnostic support such as blood tests.

- **Music & Performing Arts:**

Weekly music classes were conducted in collaboration with Manzil Mystics, providing children opportunities for creative expression and stage performances.

- **Sports Day & Community Advocacy:**

A Sports Day was organized, beginning with a rally led by children advocating for safe play spaces ("झूलों वाला पार्क दो, फूलों वाला पार्क दो"). The event saw participation from the local MLA and SHO, and a memorandum was submitted to MLA by children to highlight community children demands.

Celebration of Festivals:

Major festivals such as Diwali, Christmas, New Year, and national festivals were celebrated to promote cultural awareness, joy, and inclusivity.

- **Children's Gatherings:**

Regular gatherings were organized where children shared homemade food with one



another, fostering a sense of community, sharing, and mutual respect.

- **Safe Space for Children – Little Stars Home:**

The “**Little Stars Home**” initiative provides a safe, nurturing, and positive environment for children, protecting them from abusive surroundings, negative influences, and harmful behaviors, while supporting their holistic growth and development.



KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Centres operational in multiple shifts
- Average attendance increased from **50 to 120 children**

ACTIVITIES:

- Academic support & remedial classes
- Level-based learning
- Drawing, music, and creative activities
- Nutrition support (eggs distribution from Jan to March, food distribution: time to time)
- Monthly parent meetings

OUTCOMES:

- 7 children enrolled in schools
- 70 students passed annual exams
- Significant improvement in learning levels of children attending classes at our learning centre.

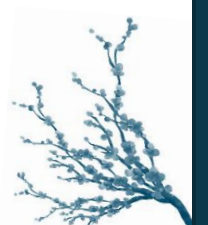

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION WITH CSOs AND AREA COUNCILLOR

Sanrakshan Trust convened a community consultation on 15 January 2026 at its office in New Seemapuri, Delhi, to address persistent civic challenges affecting the daily lives of residents. The meeting brought together



approximately 75 participants, including members of waste picker families, women, elderly persons, and persons with disabilities, along with representatives from various civil society organisations and the area Councillor, Smt. Mohini Jeenwal. The primary objective of the consultation was to present ground-level realities to the concerned authorities, identify systemic gaps in service delivery, and collectively explore sustainable and accountable solutions.



The consultation highlighted the pressing challenges faced by the community in New Seemapuri, a densely populated settlement where inadequate civic infrastructure has significantly impacted living conditions. Residents, particularly those engaged in informal waste picking, continue to struggle with irregular garbage collection, open dumping, choked drains, frequent water logging, and overflowing sewer lines. Poor sanitation and the absence of regular cleaning drives have further aggravated these issues, leading to unhygienic surroundings, foul odour, and the proliferation of mosquito breeding sites. These conditions have increased the risk of water-borne and vector-borne diseases and have had a disproportionate impact on vulnerable groups such as children, women, elderly persons, and persons with disabilities.

In addition to these civic concerns, the community continues to face significant barriers in accessing basic identity documentation. The lack of essential documents, particularly birth certificates, has resulted in the exclusion of many children from formal education, healthcare services, Aadhaar enrolment, and access to financial systems such as bank accounts. Despite repeated efforts and complaints raised by residents, civil society organisations, schools, and financial institutions, the responses from relevant authorities have largely remained temporary or insufficient. This consultation therefore underscored the urgent need for coordinated, long-term interventions to address both civic infrastructure gaps and documentation-related exclusion.

15. CHALLENGES

- Government portal issues and technical glitches delaying applications and approvals
- Lack of basic documentation among families, leading to exclusion from essential services and schemes
- Limited financial and human resources to meet the growing needs of the community
- Persistent social stigma around mental health, disability, and gender-related issues, hindering access to support
- Prevalence of superstition and strong belief in rituals and occult practices over scientific approaches, affecting informed decision-making
- Economic vulnerability of families, impacting consistent participation in programs and access to opportunities
- Staff experiencing emotional burnout due to high-intensity, community-based work and exposure to distressing situations
- Low awareness about rights and entitlements, resulting in underutilization of available government schemes
- Gaps in coordination between departments and service providers, causing delays and inefficiencies
- Mobility and migration of families, making continuity of interventions and follow-ups challenging

This version presents a more comprehensive and realistic picture of on-ground challenges.

16. CASE STUDIES (HIGHLIGHTS)

1. DEEPANSHI (DISABILITY SUPPORT)

Support with a medical cushion improved her health post-surgery and enabled her to continue her physiotherapy studies.

2. FAMILY LEGAL INTERVENTION

A harassment case involving children with disabilities was resolved through legal mediation, restoring safety and dignity.

3. EDUCATION SUPPORT

Samira (name changed) approached us just a day before the deadline to seek support for submitting her Delhi University final-year fees. We immediately

initiated an appeal, and we are happy to share that, the very same day, our well-wishers came forward to help her complete her degree.

- Facilitate easy access to UDID registration and disability certification.
- Provide life support through special education, physiotherapy sessions and therapy-based interventions.

INCREASE SCHOOL ENROLMENT & RETENTION

Ensure every child is enrolled, attends regularly and continues learning in a safe, supportive and inclusive environment.

Increase the number of teachers to adequately support all children being enrolled in formal education during the current academic session; they will also act as a bridge between schools and the community.

PROMOTE WOMEN'S SHGS AND LIVELIHOODS

Strengthen Self Help Groups and create sustainable livelihood opportunities to promote economic empowerment and financial independence.

SCALE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Expand access to mental health support, counselling and referral services to promote emotional well-being for all.

BUILD ADOLESCENT GIRLS' AND BOYS GROUPS

Create safe spaces for adolescents to build life skills, confidence, leadership and support each other.

ENHANCE AWARENESS THROUGH IEC AND COMMUNITY CAMPAIGNS

Use Information, Education and Communication (IEC) and community campaigns to spread awareness, change social norms and drive positive behaviour.

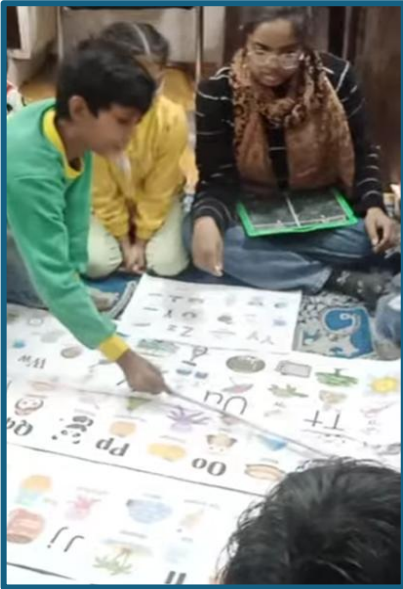
